Discussion:

- Read Joshua 21.43-45. What is the big emphasis on God's character in these verses and in Joshua so far? How has that been an encouragement to you to read about?
- Read Joshua 22. What strikes you from verse 5 about the life God is calling these tribes to live? What might God be asking you to address in light of this verse?
- What strikes you about this "almost civil-war"? What legitimate factors contributed? What less noble factors played a part?
- One factor for the strife may have been based on a "geographical prejudice" that was causing the western tribes to look down on/question the eastern tribes belonging to Israel. What factors could make us fall into the same kind of prejudicial thinking? How do we guard against that? What prejudices/biases could make you avoid someone initially at NW?
- How do we keep our common faith in Jesus as a uniting factor that trumps our differences (v. 34)?
- Are there any actions steps for your group to help our church with this issue of prejudicial divisions? for you personally?
